Monday 22.02.10	Cardiology for private practice <i>G. Wess</i>	Cardiology made easy - in this workshop participants will work through cardiology case examples followed by short lectures on specific topics such as: How can I diagnose heart disease using diagnostics such as auscultation, new biomarkers (NTproBNP), ECG, and radiographs? Which test is the best for which problem? How to treat cardiac emergency cases? What's new in heart failure treatment? After this workshop participants will be able to solve some of the most common cardiac problems - discussions are expected and will maximise the learning experience, enhanced by the limited number of attending veterinarians.
Tuesday 23.02.10	Canine internal medicine cases <i>K. Hartmann and S. Unterer</i>	Be detective and trace down challenging CANINE internal medicine cases! This exciting workshop will focus on interactive case discussions using the problem-oriented approach to solve rewarding internal medicine cases. In small groups, you will actively participate in the problem-solving process. In addition, we will discuss interpretation of laboratory results including urinalysis and critically debate specific diagnostic tests and procedures. Therapeutic options and case management will also be part of the discussion.
Wednesday 24.02.10	Feline internal medicine cases <i>B. Schulz, and R. Dorsch</i>	Be detective and trace down challenging FELINE internal medicine cases! This exciting workshop will focus on interactive case discussions using the problem-oriented approach to solve rewarding internal medicine cases. In small groups, you will actively participate in the problem-solving process. Thursday 25.02.10	Neurology made easy <i>T. Steinberg</i>	In this workshop participants will work through neurological case examples. Pros and cons of various diagnostic tests, pitfalls to a correct diagnosis and details of the successful therapy will be discussed. Active participation and discussions are expected and will maximise the learning experience, enhanced by the limited number of attending veterinarians. After that workshop neurology will be fun!
Friday 26.02.10	Endocrinology <i>A. Wehner</i>	In this workshop endocrinology problems will be worked up with the aid of practical case examples using an interactive and problem-oriented approach. With the help of case examples it will be demonstrated, how diagnostic tools can be employed reasonably and how results can be interpreted. Current treatment options for endocrinology diseases will be presented and common reasons for therapy failure will be shown. The work-up of case examples will be in an interactive way with inclusion of all participants of the course. Thus, active discussion will be specifically encouraged. Which test do you have to perform to diagnose, and why one test is often not enough are only small examples of what will be discussed in this workshop.
